The Trust completed a review of our Literacy strategy on Wednesday. Mr Groom has developed this over the past year, and you can read more about it [on our website](#). Moving forwards, we will be putting a phonics scheme in place to support weaker readers at KS3, using teaching methods students will be familiar with from primary school.

We also spent some time looking at reading - this is key to students accessing the whole curriculum, not just English lessons. As parent of a 15 year old boy, I am well aware that reading for pleasure is not at the top of the priority list, and that wading through treacle may be easier than encouraging a love of sitting down with a book. However, we have persevered and found autobiographies a source of interest.

We're currently reading 'Can't Hurt Me' by David Goggins, a retired Navy SEAL. In it, he says that to be successful we "have to become addicted to hard work. Because passion and obsession, even talent, are only useful tools if you have the work ethic to back them up." Wide words indeed.
