Careers Overview: Year 7 to Year 11

Introduction:

The Careers Programme at Pakefield High School aims to provide a comprehensive and dynamic curriculum that supports all students from Year 7 to Year 11 in developing their understanding of different career paths, building essential skills for the workplace, and making informed decisions about their future. The programme aligns with the statutory Provider Access Legislation and is designed to meet all eight Gatsby Benchmarks for Good Career Guidance.

Aims:

- 1. To provide high-quality, impartial careers advice and guidance that meets the individual needs of every student.
- 2. To raise aspirations and promote a culture of ambition and self-belief.
- 3. To ensure all students have the opportunity to learn from employers and employees, and to experience workplaces first-hand.
- 4. To support students in making informed choices about their education and career pathways.
