## Key Reminders

### Uniform

Please ensure your child returns in full compliance with our uniform policy, which is available on our website. In summary, students should wear:

- School blazer or jumper with the school logo
- White shirt or blouse
- School gold tie
- One of the following:
  - Plain dark grey or black trousers (formal, loose fit, ankle-length)
  - Plain dark grey or black shorts (formal, loose fit)
  - Pleated Pakefield knee-length grey school skirt
- Polishable or patent formal black shoes
- Jewellery should be discreet and appropriate for school. Students may wear:
  - One set of plain studs or small sleepers in pierced ears
  - One small nose stud
  - One watch, necklace, bracelet, or ring



## Equipment

All students are expected to arrive fully equipped for learning. This includes:

- Calculator (Casio FX-83 or FX-85 preferred)
- PE kit (when applicable)

## Attendance

Excellent attendance is a key priority. We ask for your continued support in ensuring your child attends school every day and arrives on time.

- On Thursday 27th November 2025, the John Innes Centre is hosting a unique 1-day conference for Year 8 students, designed to inspire the next generation of STEM professionals.
- Students will hear from and meet inspirational speakers through taking part in interactive workshops and networking sessions.
- Places are limited to 12 students.

STEM jobs are careers in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics that require technical, analytical, and problem-solving skills.

### Examples of STEM jobs:

Science: Forensic scientist, neuroscientist, ecologist.

Technology: Software developer, web developer, IT manager, database administrator.

Engineering: Mechanical engineer, biomedical engineer, aerospace engineer, civil engineer, environmental engineer.

Mathematics: Actuary, statistician, cost estimator.

Other: Psychologist, physiotherapist, medical roles, and finance sector roles.

### Healthcare Science virtual work experience programme

There are over fifty thousand healthcare scientists working in the NHS and public health services. They operate at the cutting edge of innovation, supporting the diagnosis, prevention and treatment of disease. If you are passionate about science and technology, and about helping others, a career in healthcare science could be the perfect match for you.

Healthcare scientists work in over fifty specialisms which can be categorised into four groups:



NHS England have just introduced an exciting new Healthcare Science Virtual Work Experience opportunity, in collaboration with Springpod, which can be accessed on an unlimited basis by anyone over the age of thirteen, across the UK.

The programme aims to break down barriers to traditional work experience and provide more accessible and inclusive options for young people to explore careers in the Healthcare Sciences. It contains a variety of content including quizzes, videos, activities and pre-recorded webinars/Q&As, as well as an opportunity to live chat with a healthcare science ambassador. Modules cover an introduction to healthcare science, details of different specialisms, entry routes, career planning, and employability skills. You can start straight away and complete the course at your own pace.
